
Reaching New Heights!

Crust

- 1-1/4 cups
 all-purpose flour
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/2 cup cold butter, cubed
- 3-4 Tbsp ice water





Chocolate Filling

- 9-inch pre-baked pie crust
- ³/₄ cup sugar
- 4 heaping Tbsp cocoa
- 2 cups whole milk
- 1tsp vanilla


- 3 Tbsp cornstarch
- A pinch of salt
- 4 egg yolks
- 2 Tbsp butter
- 1/4 cup semi sweet chocolate chips

Meringue

- 4 egg whites
- A pinch of salt
- 1/4 of a cup sugar
- 1/4 tsp cream of tartar
- A few drops of vanilla

According to Ambie Yesus, "It was great but the chocolate overpowered the meringue and the pie crust was too hard. So you should add more vanilla to the meringue and cut the butter into smaller pieces. Ambie rated it 8/10 or 4 stars out of 5. According to Yosi Antebi, "It was delicious but the meringue needed more flavor. And the pie crust needed to be more flaky by cutting butter into smaller pieces." He says it is $8\frac{1}{2}/10$ or 4 and a half stars out of 5.






